1: MPhil in African Studies

Students admitted to the MPhil in African Studies may be liable for additional costs associated with research-related travel and/or fieldwork expenses, depending on their chosen dissertation project.

2: PhD in Antarctic Studies

Certain projects may require additional funds for fieldwork or laboratory costs. In some cases students may need to contribute to these costs.

3: MAST in Applied Mathematics

All M.A.St. courses are treated as undergraduate courses for fee purposes. Overseas students are therefore also charged the undergraduate College fee. This varies from College to College. The *estimated* financial liability for the overseas College fee for admission in 2016-17 is £8,625 and is in addition to the University Composition Fee and maintenance costs.

4: MPhil in Archaeological Research

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork or research trips. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application.

5: MPhil in Archaeology

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork or research trips. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application.

6: PhD in Archaeology

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork or research trips. It is possible to apply for additional funding to cover some of these costs. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application.

7: PhD in Architecture

Most of our students find it useful to work with a laptop.

Whilst our libraries are excellent, some students prefer to purchase books for their own use. They may also choose to undertake research which necessitates specialist equipment and materials.

The Department advocates that students plan for research which they can arrange funding for. Fieldwork, visits and research which take(s) place overseas can be costly.

8: MPhil in Architecture and Urban Design

Any full-time student eligible for Home/EU fees who started their Part 1 course before 1 September 2012 will be treated as an existing student for the duration of the course and will be subject to different fees from those listed above. This will be the case even if they switch institutions between Part 1 and Part 2 as long as they remain in the UK, do not change their mode of study (eg from full to part-time), and do not have a gap of more than 3 years after completing Part 1. Contact grad.enquiries@aha.cam.ac.uk if you think that you may be eligible to be charged 'old regime' fees.

Whilst there are bursaries available on a competitive basis, students are expected to meet or arrange for the costs of their fieldwork. Students are also expected to fund their own materials and equipment; eg paper and print.

PLEASE NOTE: The fees currently shown for this course are the previous year's figures as the fees for 2017/18 have not yet been confirmed but will be updated in due course. Thank you.

9: MPhil in Architecture and Urban Studies

The department subsidizes printing for all students, although students have to cover part of the cost. Other costs include voluntary trips to conferences, usually within the United Kingdom. Sometimes, field trips are useful in order to carry out research. The university and its colleges offer small bursaries for graduate students to give papers at conferences and go on field trips. Bursaries are awarded on a competitive basis and may not cover the full cost of the trip. Students are expected to purchase relevant books and other basic working material (such as stationery).

10: MPhil in Assyriology

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork or research trips. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application.

11: MAST in Astrophysics

All MAST courses are treated as undergraduate courses for fee purposes. Overseas students are therefore also charged the undergraduate College fee. This varies from College to College. The *estimated* financial liability for the overseas College fee for admission in 2016-17 is £8,625 and is in addition to the University Composition Fee and maintenance costs.

12: PhD in Biochemistry

The costs involved in conducting the research project (consumables costs) may be covered in some scholarships or studentships. However, consumables costs are not covered by all such awards. Consequently, in the absence of such consumables funding being provided, students may be required to bring funds of at least £5,000 per annum to cover the necessary consumables costs. For some projects with very high consumables demands significantly more than £5,000 per annum may be required.

13: MPhil in Biological Anthropological Science

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork or laboratory work, depending on the applicant's specific research interests. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application.

14: PhD in Biological Anthropology

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork or laboratory work, depending on a student's research interests. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application.

15: MPhil in Biological Science (Biochemistry)

As with the PhD programme, the experimental costs (consumables costs) involved in conducting the one-year MPhil research project may be covered in some scholarships or studentships. However, in the absence of such funding being provided, students may be required to bring funds of at least £5,000 to cover the consumables costs. For particular projects that demand exceptionally high consumables expenditure, provision of funds significantly above £5,000 may be required from the student.

16: MPhil in Biological Science (Zoology)

Additional research costs are likely (e.g. lab consumables or fieldwork), but the amount will depend on the nature of the project. Applicants should discuss requirements with the prospective supervisor, who will be asked to confirm how these costs will be met prior to a conditional offer being made.

17: PhD in Biological Sciences at the Department of Veterinary Medicine

Depending on the project chosen by the student there may be additional expenses incurred for consumables or use of specialised equipment or services. A project may also incur additional costs if there is a large amount of travel and fieldwork required. We will endeavour to keep the amount to be charged to the student to a minimum and this will be discussed with the candidate prior to any offer being made. Most projects offered by the Department are without additional costs.

18: MPhil in Bioscience Enterprise

Additional Costs: £ 500

There is usually an opportunity to gain a global perspective of the industry sector during a study tour to a international biotechnology business cluster, an event that is planned and led by members of the class. Additional costs are incurred by students who elect to participate in this activity or incur other discretionary expenses associated with participation in the programme. The latter may include: UK company visits; conference attendance; travel, occasional meals and refreshments; joint membership of an industry organisation and other miscellaneous expenses.

19: Executive Master of Business Administration

In addition to the course fee, participants are required to pay for their accommodation while in Cambridge, travel costs to and from Cambridge, and travel costs to and from the country in which the international business trip takes place.

20: MPhil in Computational Biology

This course involves a mandatory internship. Students are advised that the Department does not provide funding to cover any costs incurred as a result of carrying out this internship (eg. travel costs). Whilst many students carry out their internship in Cambridge, some may choose to go further afield. Those students who undertake internships outside of Cambridge will be expected to meet any additional costs themselves, unless arrangements can be made with the host organisation. If working away, the costs of returning to Cambridge in order to deliver the final assessed presentation will also need to be met by the student.

21: EPSRC CDT MPhil + PhD in Computational Methods for Materials Science

Certain projects may require additional funds for laboratory, field work and long term attachment costs. This could include equipment, books, IT, photocopying, bespoke training, travel for conferences, research trips, summer schools and/or fieldwork costs.

Supervisors are often able to cover these costs, or partially contribute to these costs, depending on the financial resources available. Where not possible, or where research related costs are not specifically included in a stipend, or if students are self-funded, students will usually be expected to raise the associated research costs themselves. In some cases research costs may be much higher, for example if a long term attachment is required, and in these cases applicants should agree with their Supervisor what an appropriate amount might be, or consider a more feasible project, before accepting an offer or signing the Financial Undertaking Form.

22: MPhil in Conservation Leadership

Costs of field trips and practicals that form part of the coursework modules are met by the course.

In some cases students undertake fieldwork for their professional placement which incurs additional costs. These costs are sometimes covered by the organisation hosting the placement, but in other cases they are covered by the student from their personal funds. Any possible shortfall that would need to be covered by the student is made clear at the stage of selecting a placement. There are always many placements available that involve no additional cost to students, meaning that the availability of additional funds is not in any way a limiting factor on the ability of a student to complete the course. Where additional funds need to be raised for a placement, students are sometimes able to find support from their college or departmental fieldwork funds, although these cannot be guaranteed. The maximum shortfall that a student might need to find to cover a placement that involves additional costs is in the region of £2000.

23: PhD in Development Studies

There might be additional costs linked to fieldwork (flights, accommodation during fieldwork, etc...). No estimate can be given as this is entirely dependent on the nature of each individual research project. Applicants should consider this carefully before applying for the course. There is only limited financial help available through the Department to support the costs of fieldwork.

24: PhD in Education

If students are conducting fieldwork there will normally be expenses associated with this. These will vary, depending on the nature and location of the fieldwork. Students can apply for financial assistance to help with the costs of fieldwork.

25: Doctor of Education

If students are conducting fieldwork there may be expenses associated with this. These will vary, depending on the nature and location of the fieldwork.

26: Master of Education (Child and Adolescent Psychotherapeutic Counselling)

Additional Costs: £ 1,074

Please note that this accredited course charges a supplementary programme fee due to the additional teaching hours provided on the course. This extra element carries a fee of £1074 over the two years of the course, payable in full at the beginning of the course.

27: MPhil in Education (Psychology and Education)

Additional Costs: £ 1,342

This course is accredited as a graduate conversion course by the British Psychological Society (BPS) provided students complete work in addition to the Masters during their time with us. This optional extra element carries a fee of £1342 for the course.

Graduate basis for chartered membership (GBC), granted by the BPS, allows you to proceed onto courses offering professional training as a Chartered Psychologist (for example, educational or clinical psychology). If you are not planning to become a chartered psychologist in the UK, then GBC is not a necessary element for your Masters work with us, so you can simply follow the Psychology and Education Masters without the additional BPS element. In such cases the additional fee will not be payable.

28: Master of Education (Psychology and Education)

Additional Costs: £ 1,342

This course is accredited as a graduate conversion course by the British Psychological Society (BPS) provided students complete work in addition to the Masters during their time with us. This optional extra element carries a fee of £1342 for the course (not per annum).

Graduate basis for chartered membership (GBC), granted by the BPS, allows you to proceed onto courses offering professional training as a Chartered Psychologist (for example, educational or clinical psychology). If you are not planning to become a chartered psychologist in the UK, then GBC is not a necessary element for your Masters work with us, so you can simply follow the Psychology and Education Masters without the additional BPS element. In such cases the additional fee will not be payable.

29: MPhil in Egyptology

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork or research trips. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application.

30: MPhil in Geographical Research

Although not mandatory, some students conduct fieldwork as part of their pilot study. This often takes place in Cambridge to test methodological approaches. Alternatively, some students travel to research sites away from Cambridge. These trips may incur additional travel and maintenance costs for the student.

31: MPhil in Geography

Certain projects may require additional funds for laboratory costs or field-work costs (see <http://www.geog.cam.ac.uk/facilities/laboratories/prices/>).

Applicants should select the MPhil in Geography when making their application. Overseas (non-EU) applicants will need to be aware that different conditions apply depending on the topic of the research project. The department will decide which category your application falls into. This will be either Natural Science/Physical Geography, which carries the Science fee and requires an ATAS statement, or Social Science and Humanities/Human Geography, which carries the Arts fee and does not need an ATAS statement.

32: PhD in Geography

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork, research trips or laboratory work. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application. Once students are in the Department, there are limited Department funds that students can apply for. However, this is likely to be insufficient to cover all costs, so students may have to find additional funding elsewhere.

Overseas (non-EU) applicants will need to be aware that different conditions apply depending on the topic of the research project. Applicants should select the 'PhD (probationary) in Geography' (EAGG22) when making an application and the correct course code will be chosen by the Department at the offer stage, whether EAGG21 (Social Science and Humanities) or EAGG22 (Natural Science). The course code will affect the level of fee you pay if you are an overseas applicant and whether or not you need an ATAS statement: EAGG22 requires an ATAS statement for your visa application and carries a Science fee.

33: PhD in History

Many of our students choose to spend a period working away from Cambridge, to conduct research relevant to their PhD. The Faculty has some funds available to help cover the associated fieldwork costs, but demand for these funds is always very high. Students are advised to consider their fieldwork requirements when submitting an application, and to discuss these during the interview where possible.

34: PhD in History of Art

Most of our students find it useful to work with a laptop.

Whilst our libraries are excellent, some students prefer to purchase books for their own use. They may also choose to undertake research which necessitates specialist equipment and materials.

The Department advocates that students plan for research which they can arrange funding for. Fieldwork, visits and research which take(s) place overseas can be costly.

35: MPhil in History of Art and Architecture

Most of our students find it useful to work with a laptop.

Whilst our libraries are excellent, some students prefer to purchase books for their own use. They also may choose to undertake research which necessitates specialist equipment and materials.

The Department advocates that students plan for research which they can arrange funding for. Fieldwork, visits and research which take(s) place overseas can be costly.

36: MPhil in Industrial Systems, Manufacture, and Management

Additional Costs: £ 4,000

There is an additional fee covering the cost of company visits, overseas study tour, lodging for company projects and leadership courses outside of Cambridge.

37: MPhil in International Relations and Politics

Students wishing to undertake research abroad will incur costs for flights, accommodation and subsistence. If you have any concerns about this please speak to the admissions administrator before applying, noting that research abroad is not a mandatory part of the MPhil course.

38: PhD in Land Economy

Fieldwork costs: some projects will involve fieldwork away from Cambridge, costs of travel, accommodation and any local costs for accessing sites, documentation or data should be considered. Some financial assistance is available from the Department for fieldwork costs, students may also be able to obtain some funds from their College, but students should be aware that they may need to cover some of the cost of their fieldwork themselves.

39: MPhil in Latin American Studies

Students wishing to undertake research or fieldwork in Latin America will incur costs for flights, accommodation and subsistence. There are sources of funding available to students to apply to for research trips, e.g. the Simon Bolivar Fund and the Santander Student Travel Grants scheme, but students should not expect all of the costs of their research trip to be covered. If you have any concerns about this please speak to a member of CLAS staff before applying noting that research abroad is not a mandatory part of the MPhil course.

40: PhD in Latin American Studies

Students wishing to undertake research or fieldwork in Latin America will incur costs for flights, accommodation and subsistence. There are sources of funding available to students to apply to for research trips, e.g. the Simon Bolivar Fund and the Santander Student Travel Grants scheme, but students should not expect all of the costs of their research trip to be covered. If you have any concerns about this please speak to a member of CLAS staff before applying noting that research abroad is not a mandatory part of the course.

41: Master of Music

Organ Recital and Continuo option:

Four one hour supervisions are provided for by the Faculty to cover fees of up to £40 an hour. Depending on the choice of organ teacher and the number of lessons taken, extra funding may be required from private funds.

Training in additional practical skills:

MMus students undertaking additional training in keyboard or instrumental skills will have to meet the cost of lessons from private funds.

42: MAST in Materials Science

All MAST courses are treated as undergraduate courses for fee purposes. Overseas students are therefore also charged the undergraduate College fee. This varies from College to College. The *estimated* financial liability for the overseas College fee for admission in 2016-17 is £8,625 and is in addition to the University Composition Fee and maintenance costs.

43: MAST in Mathematical Statistics

All M.A.St. courses are treated as undergraduate courses for fee purposes. Overseas students are therefore also charged the undergraduate College fee. This varies from College to College. The *estimated* financial liability for the overseas College fee for admission in 2016-17 is £8,625 and is in addition to the University Composition Fee and maintenance costs.

44: MD (Doctor of Medicine)

The fee for the entire course is £7,625 but can be paid in five equal instalments of £1,525. Any outstanding balance is payable before submission of the dissertation.

45: MPhil in Medical Science (CRUKCI)

Applicants without a competitive studentship to support their studies will be liable for an additional £23,000 per annum (consumables funding) in addition to the cost of study stated by the University.

46: PhD in Medical Science (CRUKCI)

Applicants without a competitive studentship to support their studies will be liable for an additional £23,000 per annum (consumables funding) in addition to the cost of study stated by the University.

47: PhD in Medical Science (MRC Cancer Unit)

Some students may be liable for additional bench fees to support access to laboratory facilities; applicants will be informed of these fees prior to offer.

48: MPhil in Medical Science (MRC Cancer Unit)

Some students may be liable for additional bench fees to support access to laboratory facilities; applicants will be informed of these fees prior to offer

49: MPhil in Medical Science (Obstetrics and Gynaecology)

Additional Costs: £ 4,000

A contribution to laboratory costs of £4000 is requested of all students on this course.

50: MPhil in Medical Science (Psychiatry)

Research related costs per academic year may reach £5000, depending on the project. This includes equipment, books, IT, photocopying, travel for conferences and/or fieldwork costs. Supervisors are often able to partially contribute to these costs depending on the financial resources available. When not possible, and research related costs are not specifically included in your stipend, or you are self-funded, you will usually be expected to raise the associated research costs yourself and you will need to provide evidence that this will be possible. In some cases research costs may be much higher, and you should agree with your supervisor what an appropriate amount might be or consider a more feasible project before signing the Financial Undertaking Form.

51: MPhil in Medical Science (Radiology)

Additional Costs: £ 2,000

The Department reserves the right to charge £5,000 p.a. in bench fees to cover the costs incurred (e.g. IT and research expenditure) not otherwise covered by an external funding source (such as a grant) - for instance, where a student is self-funding.

52: MPhil in Medical Science (Surgery)

Additional Costs: £ 10,000

MPhil bench fees of around £10,000 per annum may be required, depending on the research project and availability of additional research funds. The costs of the research project must be discussed with the supervisor and the source of funds identified before the student can be accepted onto the course.

53: MPhil in Medieval History

Students on the MPhil in Medieval History are required to attend a pre-sessional Intensive Latin course and there may be costs associated with this additional study, including accommodation and living expenses.

54: Wellcome Trust MRes + PhD in Metabolic and Cardiovascular Disease

The programme provides fully funded studentships for 4-5 students per year.

Students funded by alternative sources will not be considered.

55: MPhil in Micro and Nanotechnology Enterprise

Students should be aware that they will need to be available in Cambridge for up to two weeks after the hand-in date for their project dissertation (usually mid July) for a viva voce examination. This will mean that additional living costs may be incurred.

56: MPhil in Multi-disciplinary Gender Studies

Additional Costs: £ 25

Students purchase MPhil core reading Text Packs for x 24 subjects at a total cost of £25.00 per student.

57: PhD in Multi-disciplinary Gender Studies

Students wishing to undertake fieldwork will incur costs for flights, accommodation and subsistence. There are only limited sources of funding available in the Department to support fieldwork, and this should be factored into your decision to apply. If you have any concerns about this please speak to the administrator before applying, noting that research abroad is not a mandatory part of the course.

58: MPhil in Music Studies

Students taking Ethnomusicology or opting to carry out fieldwork are advised to make additional financial provision of up to £1000. Students taking the Performance Studies track may proceed to take a recital option, which requires additional financial provision for lessons at an approximate additional cost of £1,200.

59: EPSRC CDT MRes + PhD in Nanoscience and Nanotechnology

Certain projects may require additional funds for laboratory, field work and long term attachment costs. This could include equipment, books, IT, photocopying, bespoke training, travel for conferences, research trips, summer schools and/or fieldwork costs.

Supervisors are often able to cover these costs, or partially contribute to these costs, depending on the financial resources available. Where not possible, or where research related costs are not specifically included in a stipend, or if students are self-funded, students will usually be expected to raise the associated research costs themselves. In some cases research costs may be much higher, for example if a long term attachment is required, and in these cases applicants should agree with their Supervisor what an appropriate amount might be, or consider a more feasible project, before accepting an offer or signing the Financial Undertaking Form.

60: PhD in Obstetrics and Gynaecology

Additional Costs: £ 4,000

A contribution of £4000 per annum towards laboratory costs is requested from all students.

61: MAST in Physics

All MAST courses are treated as undergraduate courses for fee purposes. Overseas students are therefore also charged the undergraduate College fee. This varies from College to College. The *estimated* financial liability for the overseas College fee for admission in 2017-18 is £8,625 and is in addition to the University Composition Fee and maintenance costs.

62: MPhil in Physics

Certain projects may require additional funds for laboratory, field work and long term attachment costs. This could include equipment, books, IT, photocopying, bespoke training, travel for conferences, research trips, summer schools and/or fieldwork costs.

Supervisors are often able to cover these costs, or partially contribute to these costs, depending on the financial resources available. Where not possible, or where research related costs are not specifically included in a stipend, or if students are self-funded, students will usually be expected to raise the associated research costs themselves. 63: PhD in Physics

64: MPhil in Polar Studies (Scott Polar Research Institute)

Although not mandatory, very occasionally a student may conduct a short period of fieldwork. These trips may incur additional travel and maintenance costs for the student.

65: PhD in Polar Studies (Scott Polar Research Institute)

Additional costs may be incurred in relation to fieldwork, research trips or laboratory work. Applicants should discuss any additional costs with their potential supervisor prior to application. Once students are in the Department, there are limited Department funds that students can apply for. However, this is likely to be insufficient to cover all costs, so students may have to find additional funding elsewhere.

The Department of Geography will decide into which category – EASP22 Geography (Natural Science) or EASP21 Geography (Social Sciences & Humanities) your application falls depending on the topic of your research project. This will affect the level of fee you pay if you are an overseas applicant and also whether or not you need an ATAS statement. EASP22 Geography (Natural Science) carries the Science fee and requires an ATAS statement, while EASP21 Geography (Social Science & Humanities) carries the Arts fee and does not require an ATAS statement.

66: PhD in Politics and International Studies

Students wishing to undertake fieldwork will incur costs for flights, accommodation and subsistence. There are only limited sources of funding available to students to apply to for research trips. If you have any concerns about this please contact the administrator before applying, noting that research abroad is not a mandatory part of the course.

67: PhD in Psychiatry

Research related costs per academic year may reach £5,000, depending on the project. This includes equipment, books, IT, photocopying, travel for conferences and/or fieldwork costs.

Supervisors are often able to partially contribute to these costs depending on the financial resources available. When not possible, and research related costs are not specifically included in your stipend, or you are self-funded, you will usually be expected to raise the associated research costs yourself and you will need to provide evidence that this will be possible.

In some cases research costs may be much higher, and you should agree with your supervisor what an appropriate amount might be or consider a more feasible project before signing the Financial Undertaking Form.

68: PhD in Psychology

If any fieldwork is required, students can apply for limited funding from the Graduate Education Committee. However this is likely to be insufficient to cover all costs, so students may have to find additional funding elsewhere.

69: MPhil in Public Policy

Students on the course undertake a compulsory work placement and applicants should be aware that the University/Department does not cover day to day subsistence costs incurred during the placement. Depending upon the location of the placement these costs may be higher than the subsistence costs which would be incurred whilst living in Cambridge for an equivalent time period (placements are typically 4-6 weeks). Applicants need to assess and allow for any additional expenses related to their placement.

70: MAST in Pure Mathematics

All M.A.St. courses are treated as undergraduate courses for fee purposes. Overseas students are therefore also charged the undergraduate College fee. This varies from College to College. The *estimated* financial liability for the overseas College fee for admission in 2016-17 is £8,625 and is in addition to the University Composition Fee and maintenance costs.

71: PhD in Radiology

The Department reserves the right to charge £5,000 p.a. in bench fees to cover the costs incurred (e.g. IT and research expenditure) not otherwise covered by an external funding source (such as a grant) - for instance, where a student is self-funding.

72: MPhil in Scientific Computing

Certain projects may require additional funds which could include equipment, books, IT, photocopying, bespoke training, travel for conferences, trips and/or fieldwork costs. Applicants should confirm with their Supervisor what an appropriate amount might be before accepting an offer or signing the Financial Undertaking Form.

73: MPhil in Social Anthropology

Students opting to undertake fieldwork as part of their dissertation research may incur additional costs for travel and equipments. Such students are advised to make additional financial provision for this.

74: MRes in Social Anthropology

Students opting to undertake a fieldwork-based dissertation may incur additional costs for travel and equipment. Such students are advised to make appropriate financial provision for this prior to commencing the course.

75: PhD in Social Anthropology

All students undertake 12-18 months fieldwork during which they may incur additional costs for travel, maintenance and equipment. Students are able to apply to the University's fieldwork fund for assistance in meeting these additional costs.

76: MSt in Social Innovation

The combined graduate fee includes college membership, but does not account for the cost of travel, accommodation and subsistence during residential teaching blocks in Cambridge - three residentials (of one week each) in the first year and one residential (of one week) in the second year.

77: PhD in Surgery

Additional Costs: £ 15,000

PhD bench fees of around £15,000 per annum may be required, depending on the research project and availability of additional research funds. The costs of the research project must be discussed with the supervisor and the source of funds identified before the student can be accepted onto the course.

78: MPhil in Technology Policy

Additional Costs: £ 1,000

In addition to the University Composition Fee and College fees, an additional fee of £1,000 is required. Please note that this fee must be paid by 31 October 2017. The additional cost is for supplementary activities and includes funds for:

- £600 towards the cost of the Orientation week and Stakeholder Engagement events throughout the year. These events will include visits to Parliament and Whitehall and to leading public and private sector organisations in London and elsewhere in the UK; seminars; and an international webinar. This amount will cover the organisation of visits, travel, meal allowances and any other miscellaneous costs associated with the set-up. This fee is non-refundable.
- £400 towards the cost of an educational trip programme to Brussels or other European Union country. This amount will cover the organisation of the trip, visas, travel, accommodation, allowance for meals, company visits and costs for events organised as part of the programme. In the event that a student cannot make the trip, the non-recoverable costs will not be refunded.

79: PhD in Veterinary Medicine

Depending on the project chosen by the student there may be additional expenses incurred for consumables or use of specialised equipment or services. A project may also incur additional costs if there is a large amount of travel and fieldwork required. We will endeavour to keep the amount to be charged to the student to a minimum and this will be discussed with the candidate prior to any offer being made. Most projects offered by the Department are without additional costs.

80: Doctor of Veterinary Medicine

Depending on the project chosen by the student there may be additional expenses incurred for consumables or use of specialised equipment or services. A project may also incur additional costs if there is a large amount of travel and fieldwork required. We will endeavour to keep the amount to be charged to the student to a minimum and this will be discussed with the candidate prior to any offer being made. Most projects offered by the Department are without additional costs.

[Note from FR - some fields are locked for editing, I will advise on submitting that fees should be as PhD, JACS codes are C100, D300, D400. Length of course as per PhD. FHEQ level = 8]

81: MPhil in Veterinary Science

Not normally applied. If, exceptionally, a student proposes a very costly project not funded through the Department's research income and a supervisor can be found for this project, an appropriate level of additional fee may be required.

82: PhD in Zoology

You are likely to also need funding towards your research costs, which will depend on the exact nature of your project.
